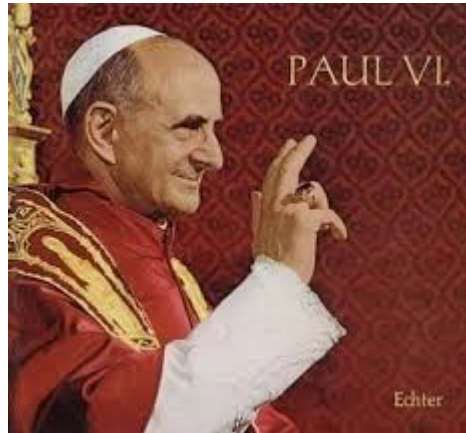
If you have been coming to St. Anthony's regularly and using envelopes from another church, but want the contributions applied to St. Anthony's and not sent to another church, please call the rectory.

This week's featured Saint — St. Paul VI



Giovanni Battista Montini, Archbishop of Milan, was elected pope in 1963. It was difficult for him to follow Pope John XXIII who was jovial and universally loved, while he was shy and some-

what reserved. And he had to implement the revolutionary vision of John who had called forth the Second Vatican Council.

But Montini was a diplomat who had served as the Vatican Secretary of State. Many Catholics thought that the Church was changing too quickly; others not fast or far enough. There was much controversy over the issue of birth control and Paul's radical positions on social justice. Paul tried to close the gap between the rich and poor in the world. He taught us that the Church must identify with the hopes and struggles of the poor and charged the world with embracing the authentic development of all peoples. He died in 1978.
